CAMPUS LIFE

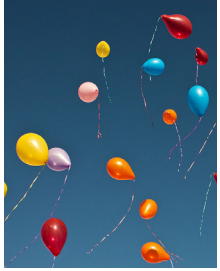

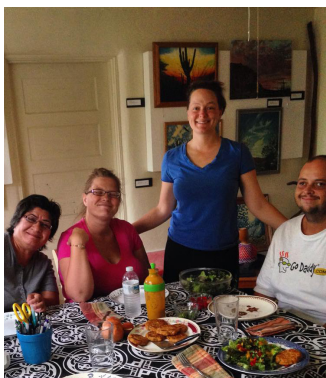


Last 10:21 Service of the Season
