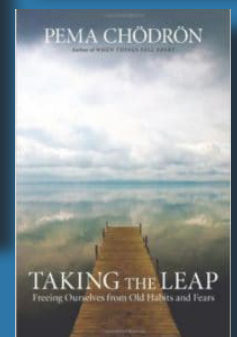
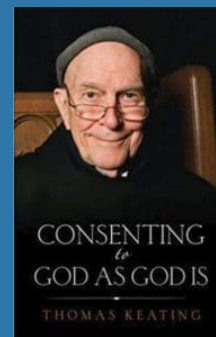
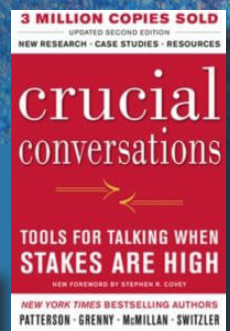
# Listening During Lent

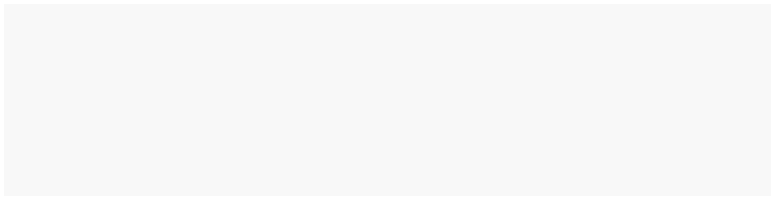
