
Usher Ministry



Our general contractor, Redden Construction, commenced demolition in mid-June and is now working to renovate the Children's Center interior, expand and completely revise the Children's playground, install a new covered walkway that will extend alongside Hutton Hall to the Children's Center, and install new underground fiber optic cabling around the campus to bring WiFi to all buildings. New equipment and materials are on order and will be installed progressively over the summer. Redden Construction is working diligently in hopes of completion sometime this fall.
